



They were organising a Mother's Day come together for local elderly women but switched to the donation and delivery of lovely gift baskets after the announcement of further restrictions and the Government guidance on the COVID 19 pandemic.

Their Mother Day hampers, filled with food, self pampering kits and hygiene products, were delivered to 15 isolated mums over 75.

Chimuanya and Elizabeth have also joined the local Community Whatsapp Chat set up by the New Addington Residents' Association as part of the Croydon COVID 19 Mutual Aid support group to assist vulnerable citizens in the community.
